Will they really? By the time of writing, Jesus himself had already risen—and still conversion was as remote as ever. With all our convictions and doctrines, what is holding us back?

Reflections

- 1. The first of the faults attributed to the rich man is his insensitivity to the abject poverty of those around him. When have you discovered that it is when you are aware of the needs of those around you and seek to make some response that you bring out the best in yourself?
- 2. The second fault attributed to the rich man is the way he ignored the word of God coming through Moses and the prophets. How have the gospels, the scriptures or your faith opened you up to a deeper and more satisfying perspective on life?
- 3. Some people look to the spectacular for a sign of God's presence and action. For Jesus, the lessons we need are not to be sought in the spectacular, but in the ordinary things of everyday life. Where have you found sacraments of God's presence in the world around you?

IF THE CHASM IS SOBIG, HOW CAN THE RICH GUY EVEN SEE LAZARUS ACROSS IT?







Observations

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus continues Luke's teaching on the Christian attitude to wealth and possessions. This time, the point is made, not by a roque such as the dishonest manager, but by a poor man, who is sick and alone. His name means "God is my help." As the parable is unique to Luke, it is most likely from hishand, illustrating his concerns in his own typical vocabulary. The powerful irony of the last line of the Gospel will be lost on no one: "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."

In this way, Luke manages a "hat trick": to give wisdom teaching (about possessions), to proclaim the resurrection and to remind us that the roots of Christianity lie in Judaism. At once, very Lucan and very contemporary.
