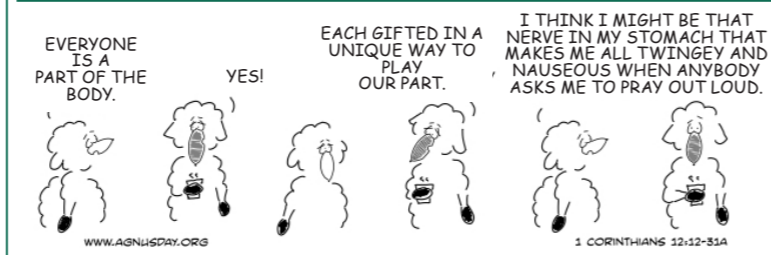

A brief introduction on Sunday's readings

First reading **Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19**
What is a prophet? The call of Jeremiah captures something of the role and challenge. It might help to call to mind prophets in our own day, people who speak out awkward truths.
Second reading **1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13**
This is a great reading—very rich and poetic. Love is praised as a person and we can see ourselves in the portrait.
Gospel **Luke 4:21-30**
This is the second half of a symbolic tableau, foreshadowing the later ministry of Jesus: the opposition he would encounter and his victory in resurrection. Jesus stands in the tradition of those prophets who suffered for their message and often paid for it with their lives.

Year of Prayer, Listening and Discernment

Family of Parish Gatherings – Next Steps: Over the next four months all the Parishes and Families of Parishes of our Diocese will be involved in the next stage of our Year of Prayer, Listening and Discernment. This will involve representatives of each Parish Leadership Team participating in 3 meetings over 3 weeks reflecting on the questions posed in Bishop Fintan's invitation in September. Since September, people individually and in Parishes, have been praying the Diocesan Prayer from the Boat. As we continue to pray this prayer together, we pray for the success of these gatherings and we pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us as together we try to pray, listen, and discern God's future for our Church.

Observations

The Sunday of the Word of God was established just six years ago by Pope Francis. The Word of God Sunday falls each year on the third Sunday in Ordinary Time, after the cycle of Christmas feasts. The choice of the third Sunday makes sense because on that day we begin reading the Gospel for that particular year from the beginning. For example, on this Sunday our Gospel is Luke 1:1-4, 4:14-21, giving us the prologue of the Gospel and the opening scene of Jesus' ministry in the synagogue at Nazareth. A good place to begin.

Each year, the Word of God Sunday has a theme. This year the theme is taken from Psalm 119 — not the whole Psalm, you will be glad to know! — but verse 74: "I hope in your Word." This year, the passage from Luke is especially appropriate for two reasons: (a) we hear the marvellous words "This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen"; and (b) we notice at the end of the Isaiah citation the programme of Jesus: "to proclaim the Lord's year of favour," that is, the jubilee year.

Reflections

1. Jesus was filled with the Spirit and sent. He came bursting with a message to communicate. When have you had the experience of being enthused by something in that way? Who have been the people you met who had that kind of enthusiasm?
2. The message Jesus had was one of liberation and he told his listeners that it was being fulfilled even as they listened. When have you had a NOW moment of liberation? When has bible reading been an experience of liberation for you?
3. His message was addressed to those who were poor, oppressed, blind, or captives. Who are these today? In what ways have I been, or am I, among these? How has the message of Jesus been good news for you, freed you, given you new sight, or revealed God's favour to you?

PRAYER

Lord, God, whose compassion embraces all peoples, whose law is wisdom, freedom, and joy for the poor, full in our midst your promise of favour, that we may receive the gospel of salvation with faith and, anointed by the Spirit, freely proclaim it.
